Dear Mayor de Blasio,

As someone who has had the experience of sitting in the mayoral chair, I understand the weight of running an American city. And when I served as President of the U.S. Conference of Mayors, I worked with mayors around the country to tackle tough problems. And yet, sometimes there are simple measures that we can take that can have a profound impact on the lives of our residents and neighbors. That's why I got involved with helping dockless bike share company LimeBike for the last year.

The LimeBike model is simple: to bring world-class bikesharing to cities across the country at zero cost to the city or taxpayers. The GPS-enabled smart bikes allow residents to locate a bike and unlock a bike, ride to their destination, and lock the bike in any legal parking space. LimeBike handles everything else, including maintenance and rebalancing. These systems can immediately bring bikeshare to your residents without bike share or complement existing systems and mobility options.

Frankly, if I had to do this all over again in Philadelphia and the technology had been available, I would have installed a dockless system like LimeBike.

While there are a number of companies operating bikeshare systems, LimeBike's approach stands out to me as the most impressive. LimeBike is an American-owned and operated company with the nation's largest fleet of bikes and staff. I have witnessed first-hand their commitment to working with over 40 communities to develop, install, and run these systems in communities of all shapes and sizes around the United States, including major cities such as Seattle and Dallas; suburbs such as Alameda, CA and Aurora, CO; and small cities such as South Bend, Indiana and Greensboro, North Carolina.
